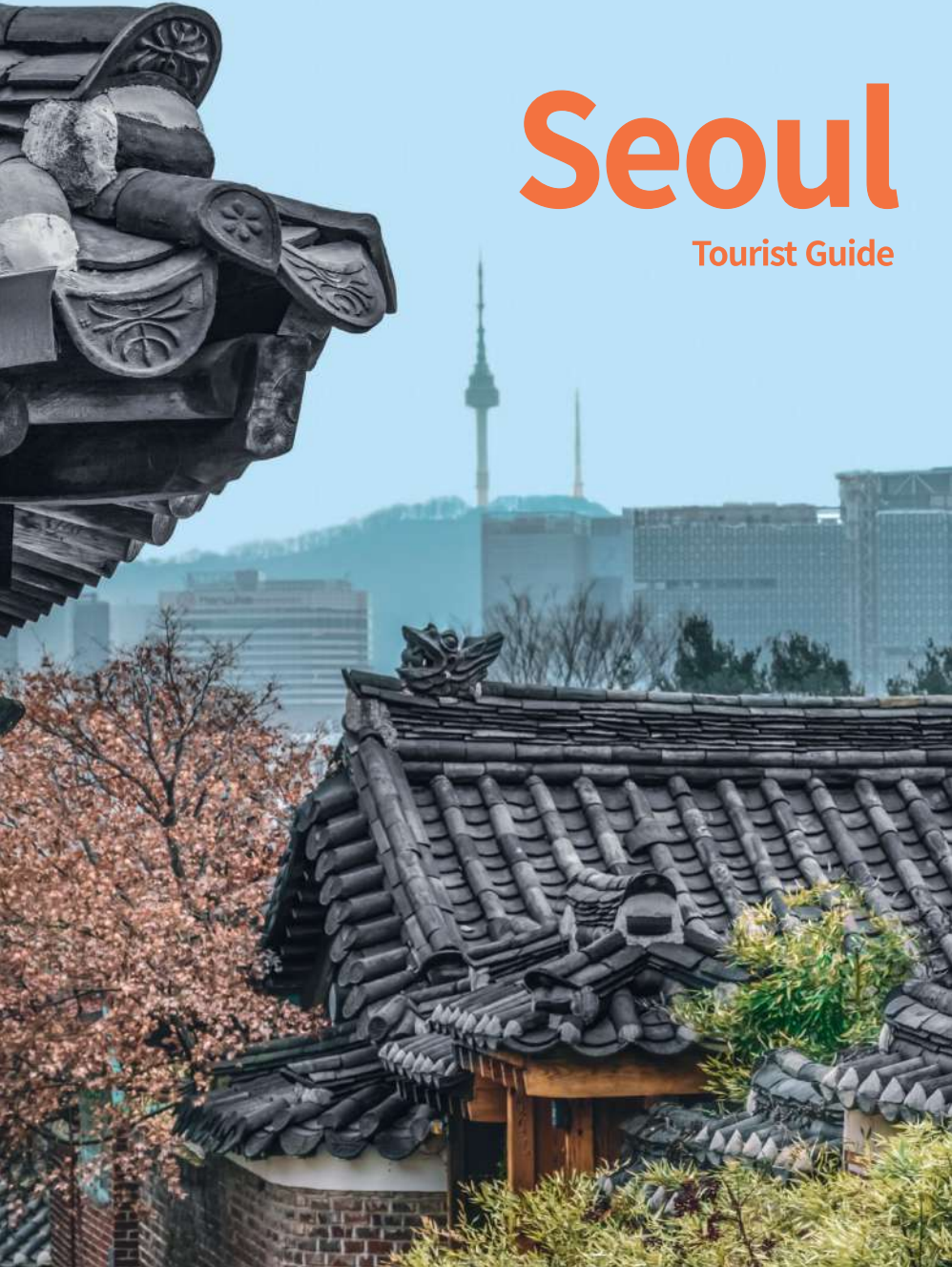

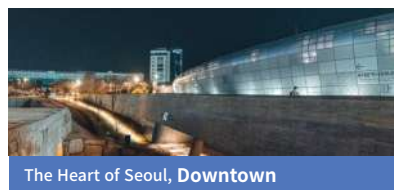

1 GYEONGBOKGUNG PALACE 경복궁



The first royal palace built in the Joseon Dynasty is where the 500-year history of Joseon began. The largest of the five grand palaces remaining in Seoul, Gyeongbokgung Palace showcases Joseon's royal culture, palace life, and architecture through Geunjeongjeon, Gyeonghoeru Pavilion, and other structures. The National Palace Museum and National Folk Museum of Korea are nearby to learn more about royal culture and historical living conditions.



2 DEOKSUGUNG PALACE 덕수궁



This Joseon Dynasty palace became the historical venue for the establishment of the Great Korean Empire. It is the only palace in Seoul that has a modern building, a Western-style garden, and a fountain. The Palace Royal Guard Changing Ceremony held every day at the main gate is a must-see attraction. The stonewall walkway that runs along Deoksugung Palace has been selected as one of the 100 Most Beautiful Roads in Korea, giving it a different feeling throughout each of the four seasons.



3 CHANGDEOKGUNG PALACE 창덕궁



This UNESCO World Heritage site is the best-preserved palace of the Joseon Dynasty. Built in 1405, Changdeokgung Palace boasts picturesque scenery as the palace where the kings of the Joseon Dynasty spent the most time. Since Rear Garden of Changdeokgung is available only to select visitors, a separate fee must be paid, aside from the fee for the palace tour. Visiting hours and the number of people allowed in at a time are also limited, so check the website for information on the Rear Garden tour.



4 CHANGGYEONGGUNG PALACE 창경궁



This palace was built by King Seongjong, the ninth king of the Joseon Dynasty, for Queen Jeonghui, the wife of King Sejo, Queen Ansun, the wife of King Yejong, and Queen Sohye, the wife of King Deokjong. Connected to Changdeokgung Palace, it formed a single palace called Donggung, and served to make up for shortage of residential space in Changdeokgung. The outstanding architectural beauty of the time is confirmed through Honghwamun, the main gate of Changgyeonggung. Korea's first Western-style greenhouse, completed in 1909, can also be seen here.

5 GYEONGHUIGUNG PALACE 경희궁

This is the smallest of the five major palaces in Seoul (Gyeongbokgung, Changdeokgung, Deoksugung, Changgyeonggung, and Gyeonghuiigung). The palace was built for the purpose of moving the king away from the main palace. There were many palaces in Gyeonghuiigung Palace, but most of the buildings disappeared or were relocated during the Period of Japanese Occupation when Gyeongseong Middle School, a Japanese school, was built on the site of the palace.



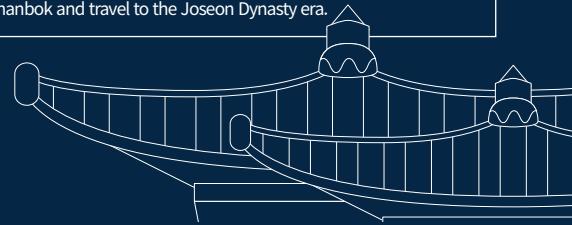
6 JONGMYO SHRINE 종묘

This shrine is where ancestral rites are held for the spirit tablets of the kings and queens of the Joseon dynasty. It was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1995. The Jongmyo Jerye, held every May, is the oldest ritual in the world that has been held since 1464, and was selected as a UNESCO masterpiece of oral tradition and intangible heritage in 2001.

From the five major palaces of Joseon with 500 years of history of the dynasty, to the shrines that serve the spirit tablets of the Joseon kings and queens. Each of the royal institutions has its own unique style and beauty.

TIP. HANBOK EXPERIENCE

Admission is free if you visit the palace wearing a hanbok, a colorful traditional Korean outfit! There are many hanbok rental shops near the palace, so it is recommended that you wear a hanbok and travel to the Joseon Dynasty era.

Surrounded by numerous mountains and forests, Seoul has many great places where people can take a leisurely stroll. From Hanyangdoseong trail, which runs along the fortress wall, to Seoul Dulle-gil, which wraps around Seoul. Let's all enjoy the beautiful scenery of Seoul while breathing in the fresh air.

1 BUKAKSAN MOUNTAIN 북악산

Towering north of Gyeongbokgung Palace, this mountain was the last mountain in Seoul that was made available to the general public for security reasons. As it is a military reservation, it is completely off-limits after sunset, so be sure to check the opening hours for a visit.

Mar.-Apr., Sep.-Oct 07:00-18:00 (last entry no later than 16:00)

May.-Aug. 07:00-19:00 (last entry no later than 17:00)

Nov.-Feb. 09:00-17:00 (last entry no later than 15:00)

Closed on Tuesdays only for mountain hiking trail through the Chunchumun Gate

Height 342m Difficulty ●●○

2 INWANGSAN MOUNTAIN 인왕산

One of the guardian mountains in Seoul, this peak is entirely made of granite. There are many rocks with strange shapes such as Train Rock, Skirt Rock, and Hat Rock. Because of the beautiful scenery, there are many landscape paintings with Mt. Inwang as the background, and representative examples include Jeong Seon's Inwangjesaekdo and Kang Hui-eon's Inwangsansdo. It is also known as a beautiful night view spot.

Height 338.2m Difficulty ●○○



3 ANSAN MOUNTAIN 안산

This mountain is relatively low. Its main route is the one east of Ansan, which goes through Seodaemun Independence Park where Seodaemun Prison is located. Here, visitors can enjoy beautiful scenery in every season. By climbing to the top, visitors can overlook the Inwangsan Mountain, Bukhansan Mountain, and the Hangang River surrounding Seoul in a sweeping view.

Height 295.5m Difficulty ●○○



4 EUNGBONSA MOUNTAIN 응봉산

As a peak towering in Eungbong-dong, this hill has been famous for its beautiful scenery since ancient times. It was also called Maebonsan because the kings of the Joseon Dynasty enjoyed hunting by releasing falcons here. The night view of Seoul from the top of the octagonal pavilion is fabulous.

Height 81m Difficulty ●○○



HANYANG DOSEONG TRAIL

A history tour where you can appreciate the history and culture of the Seoul Fortress Wall. It is divided into six sections, and visitors can savor the history and culture of each era along the Seoul Fortress Wall surrounded by Namsan Mt., Inwangsan Mt., Bukaksan Mt., and Naksan Mt.

A NAKSAN SECTION

낙산 구간

The section that extends from Hyehwamun Gate through Naksan to Heunginjimun Gate. Naksan is the lowest of the four inner mountains, and its gentle slope makes for an easy walk.

Distance 2.1km

Difficulty ●○○

D SUNGNYEMUN GATE SECTION

승례문 구간

The section that goes from Baekbeom Square through Sungnyemun Gate to the site of Donuimun Gate. It is difficult to find traces of the fortress, so please check the Hanyangdoseong Trail website before going.

Distance 1.8km

Difficulty ●○○

B HEUNGINJIMUN GATE SECTION

흥인지문 구간

The section that goes from Heunginjimun Gate through Gwanghuimun Gate to Jangchung Gymnasium. You can also enjoy shopping at nearby Dongdaemun Design Plaza and Dongdaemun Market.

Distance 1.8km

Difficulty ●○○

Duration 1hr

E INWANGSAN MOUNTAIN SECTION

인왕산 구간

The section that starts at the site of Donuimun Gate, crosses Inwangsan Mountain, and continues to Poet Yun Dong-ju's Hill. Inwangsan has many rocky sections, so be careful when climbing in winter.

Distance 4km

Difficulty ●●●

Duration 2hrs and 30mins

Departure Exit 4 of Line 5 Seodaemun Station

C NAMSAN MOUNTAIN SECTION

남산 구간

The section that goes from the back road of Jangchung Gymnasium to Namsan Park. Most of the fortress wall was destroyed during the period of Japanese Occupation, but most of it has been restored to its former appearance.

Distance 4.2km

Difficulty ●●○

Duration 3hrs

Departure Exit 5 of Line 3 Dongguk Univ. Station

F BAEGAK SECTION

백악 구간

The section that goes from Changuimun Gate to Hyehwamun Gate past Baegak Mountain. The Seoul City Wall was built with Baegak Mountain as its starting point, and Baegak Mountain is the highest among the four inner mountains.

Distance 4.7km

Difficulty ●●●

Duration 3hrs

Departure Exit 3 of Line 3 Gyeongbokgung Station



SEOUL DULLE-GIL

Dulle-gil is a trail with a total length of 156.5km that winds around Seoul. Consisting of eight trails, it weaves the history, culture, and natural ecology of Seoul into a story. It is a path that domestic and foreign visitors can enjoy and experience while walking.

① SURAKSAN-BURAMSAN ROUTE

수락·불암산 코스

This route passes through Suraksan Mountain and Buramsan Mountain. It is a route that goes around Buramsan, not through it, and reaches Taereung Royal Tomb.

Distance 18.6km

Difficulty ●●●○

Duration 8hrs 10mins

Departure Exit 2 of Line 1, 7 Dobongsan Station

③ GODEOKSAN-ILJASAN ROUTE

고덕·일자산 코스

This route finishes at Suseo Station after going past the Hangang River, Godeoksan Mountain, Iljasan Mountain, Seongnaecheon Stream, Munjeong Neighborhood Park, and Tancheon Stream. River paths, forest paths, and stream paths are all included here, allowing visitors to see and feel the natural scenery of Seoul.

Distance 25.6km

Difficulty ●○○○

Duration 8hrs 50mins

Departure Exit 2 of Line 5 Gwangnaru Station

② YONGMASAN-ACHASAN ROUTE

용마·아차산 코스

This course passes through Mukdongcheon Stream, Mangusan Mountain, Yongmasan Mountain, and Ahasan Mountain. It is a walking trail along the mountain ridge, and has the best view among the Seoul Dulle-gil routes. There is also Ahasan Ecological Park, which is full of many things to see.

Distance 12.3km

Difficulty ●●○○

Duration 5hrs and 10mins

Departure Exit 4 of Line 6 Hwarangdae Station

④ DAEMOSAN-UMYEONSAN ROUTE

대모·우면산 코스

This course arrives at Sadang Station via Daemosan, Guryongsan, and Umyeonsan. Most of them are hiking courses, but the elevation is not high, and the view of Seoul from the mountain is excellent.

Distance 18.3km

Difficulty ●●○○

Duration 8hrs 10mins

Departure Exit 6 of Line 3, Suin-Bundang Line Suseo Station

⑤ GWANAKSAN-HOAMSAN ROUTE

관악·호암산 코스

This course arrives at Suseo Station via Gwanaksan Mountain and the Samseongsan Mountain. For a walking trail along the Dulle-gil of the Gwanaksan Mountain, the natural scenery is excellent. Since historical and cultural relics are scattered throughout, there is a variety of things to see and enjoy.

Distance 13km

Difficulty ●●○○

Duration 6hrs

Departure Exit 4 of Line 2, 4 Sadang Station

⑦ BONGSAN-AENGBONGSAN ROUTE

봉산·앵봉산 코스

This course passes Noeul Park, Haneul Park, and World Cup Stadium, so many places that are difficult to pass are well equipped with pedestrian facilities. It is a course with a lot of historical heritage and many things to see.

Distance 16.8km

Difficulty ●●○○

Duration 6hrs 25mins

Departure Exit 4 of Line 9 Gayang Station

⑥ ANYANGCHEON-HANGANG ROUTE

안양천·한강 코스

This course takes you to Gayang Station by walking along the Anyangcheon Stream and the Hangang River. This entire section is flat, making it an easy walk. It is differentiated from other courses as you can walk along the Hangang River and streams.

Distance 18.2km

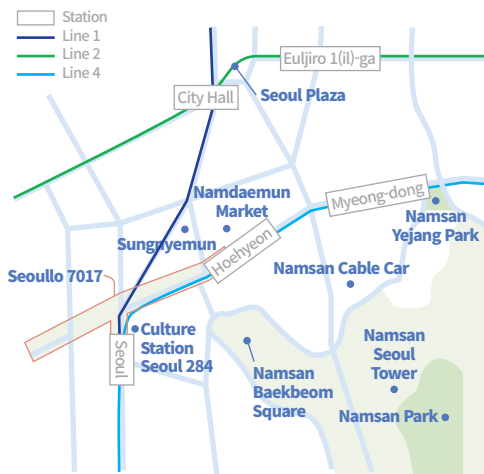

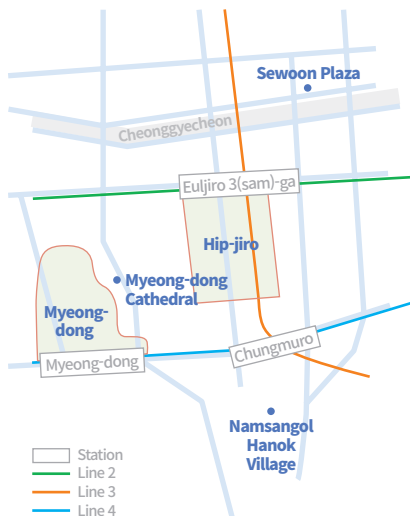

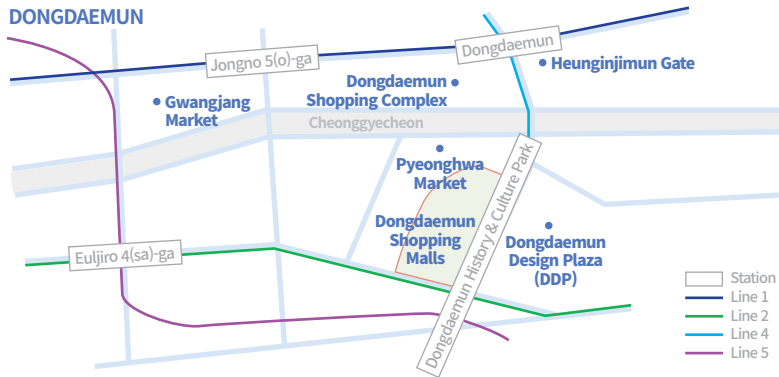

A APPENZELLER/NOBLE MEMORIAL MUSEUM

배재학당역사박물관

At this museum you can explore Korea's diplomacy, politics, culture, religion, and education in the late 19th and early 20th century. It retains its original appearance when it was established in 1916. Experiential classrooms where poet Sowol Kim studied and relics of missionary Appenzeller who founded Paichai School are on display.

Since road was fully opened to the public in 2018, many people have come to love it in all seasons. In autumn, when the ginkgo leaves turn yellow, many people visit to feel the atmosphere of autumn.

Cheongwadae, where the president lived and worked, is now fully open for the first time in 74 years and can be toured after reservation. It consists of the main building of Cheongwadae, which is located on the south side of the Bukaksan Mountain, the main mountain of Seoul during the Joseon Dynasty, the Guesthouse where large-scale conferences and official events for foreign state guests were held, and the presidential residence where the president and his family lived. In particular, the Bukaksan hiking trail that leads to the back road of Chilgung in the west of Cheongwadae and the back road of the Chunchugwan in the east has been recently opened.

In order to reproduce the street in front of Gwanghwamun, restoration work was carried out and Gwanghwamun Plaza as it is now was created. Along with Gyeongbokgung Palace and Bukaksan Mountain, you can see the statues of King Sejong the Great and Admiral Yi Sun-sin, and in the basement underneath the statues, there is the 'Story of Sejong' exhibition hall. The Sejong-daero Pedestrian Forest Path, a pedestrian-friendly street that runs from Sejong-daero Intersection to Seoul Station, is also well maintained.

Seoul's first municipal arboretum has more than 2,100 different rare plants. The arboretum operates about 20 themed gardens, including a wildflower garden and children's garden, a forest education center, a library (opened in 2022), and a gardening program. You can feel the four seasons while walking along the toenmaru (narrow wooden porch) promenade, which is laid flat in the reed reservoir.

Soul food loved by locals

There are many foods that you must try when you're in Seoul. From crispy fried chicken to spicy kimchi stew, here are some foods that people of all ages love.

So Bulgogi

A traditional home-made dish of beef marinated in gravy with spices and vegetables. It is sweet and tender.



Naengmyeon

A traditional dish topped with boiled noodles and garnish in a cold broth. The noodles are chewy and the taste of the cold broth is excellent.



Sam-gyeopsalgui

Samgyeopsal, grilled on an open fire and served with vegetables, is a tender, oily pork cut with a savory flavor.

Fried Chicken

The fried chicken is crispy on the outside and soft on the inside. Different brands sell fried chicken in different flavors. In particular, Chimaek' that combines chicken with draft beer is the best.



Doenjang-jjigae (Soybean Paste Stew)

A stew made by boiling doenjang (soy bean paste) mixed with water and various ingredients. It tastes savory.



Budae-jjigae

A representative fusion Korean dish made with Western-style ingredients such as sausages cooked Korean style

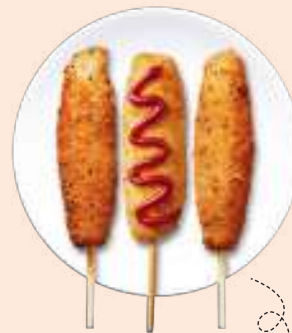
Kimchi-jjigae (Kimchi Stew)

A stew made with kimchi, the representative fermented food of Korea. Depending on the ingredients you put in, such as pork and tofu, you can enjoy various tastes.



Snacks to Enjoy on a Small Budget

Seoul smells delicious in every alley. From spicy Tteok-bokki to Bungeo-ppang as a signature winter snack, let's check out foods you can enjoy on a small budget on the streets of Seoul.



Hot Dog (Corn Dog)

A snack served with long sausages coated in flour dough and breadcrumbs, deep-fried, and then sprinkled with sugar and ketchup. There are also hot dogs with cheese and potatoes.



Bungeo-ppang (Fish-Shaped Pastry)

Bread made with red bean paste in wheat flour dough. It is a typical winter street snack. Not only bungeo-ppang with red beans but one with cream puffs and cheese is also available.

Hotteok (Sugar-filled Korean Pancake)

A dish made of wheat flour and glutinous rice, baked in a round shape with brown sugar inside. Crispy on the outside and sweet on the inside.



Gyeran ppang (Egg Bun)

Egg bread with a whole egg inside. It is a street snack that is loved for its soft, moist texture and savory taste.



Gimbap

A dish made by placing rice on seaweed and adding various ingredients to it. Depending on the ingredients, such as tuna and pork cutlet, you can enjoy a variety of flavors.

Fries

Deep-fried food such as seaweed rolls, squid, and vegetables. Dip it in Tteok-bokki sauce for a fabulous bite.



Patbingsu (Shaved Ice with Sweetened Red Beans and Other Toppings)

A popular summertime snack. Grind ice and put boiled red beans, condensed milk, fruit, etc. on top of it.

Tteok-bokki (Steir-fried Rice Cake)

A snack made by adding a spicy sauce to rice cakes. If you like a chewy and sticky texture, we recommend rice cake, and if you like a chewy texture only, we recommend wheat cake.

As vegetarians are increasing for various reasons, there are more and more restaurants in Seoul that satisfy both taste and health at the same time. There are many traditional Korean foods suitable for vegetarians, so please try them.



Dotorimuk Muchim (Seasoned Acorn Jelly Salad)

A dish made with acorn curd and various vegetables such as carrot and sesame leaf, marinated in soy sauce. Due to the sauce, it is sweet and the unique savory taste of acorn curd envelops the palate.



Buddhist Temple Cuisine

You can taste the monks' food with the taste of nature with simple ingredients at temple restaurants. Most of the dishes are simple and refreshing.



Deulkkae Kalguksu (Noodle Soup with Perilla Seed)

Deulkkae Kalguksu is a dish made by adding Kalguksu to perilla water that has been prepared by adding water to finely ground perilla seeds and filtered through a sieve.

Hobak-juk (Pumpkin Porridge) & Patjuk (Red Bean Porridge)

A pumpkin porridge made by boiling sweet pumpkin or old pumpkin and a red bean porridge made by boiling red beans and adding rice to the filtered red bean water. Both dishes are sweet and soft, so people of all ages can enjoy them.



Pajeon (Green Onion Pancake)

A flattened food made by mixing wheat flour dough with green onions and carrots. It is perfect to have with traditional liquor.



Yachae Bibimbap (Vegetable Bibimbap)

It is a major Korean food enjoyed by mixing rice and various vegetables. You can add vegetables of your choice according to your taste.

It Tastes Better if You Know More about It! Beverages

A glass of wine enjoyed with delicious food removes the fatigue of travel. From the currently popular Korean alcohols of soju and makgeolli to traditional drinks, we introduce beverages that are good to drink with food or on their own.



Sujeonggwa (Cinnamon Punch)

A traditional Korean drink prepared by boiling cinnamon and ginger in water and adding sugar or honey to it. The spiciness of cinnamon and ginger and the sweetness of sugar go well together.



Makgeolli (Rice Wine)

A unique Korean alcoholic beverage made by steaming glutinous rice, non-glutinous rice, barley, and wheat flour and mixing it with nuruk yeast and water for fermentation. Different types of makgeolli have different tastes, but in general, makgeolli has a sour and savory taste.



Yuja-cha (Citrus Tea)

A Korean tea made from thinly sliced citron pickled in sugar and brewed in boiling water. It has a sweet and sour taste.



Sikhye (Sweet Rice Punch)

A traditional Korean drink with floating grains of rice. It has a sweet taste as a cold drink that has rice fermented in malt.

Soju

As an alcoholic beverage distilled by fermenting grain, it is the most popular drink at bars. Most of the soju brands come in a green bottle and have a strong alcohol flavor. Sweet fruit soju is also available for those who can't drink alcohol.



Maekju (Beer)

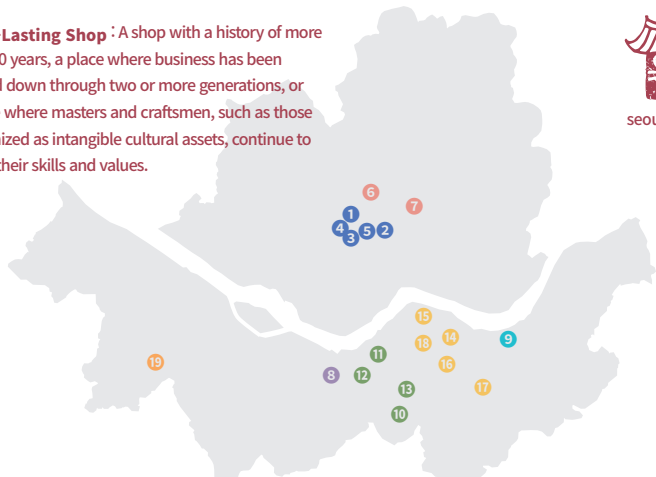

Jun.-Aug.

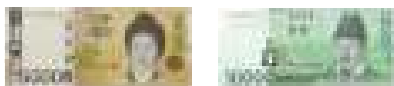

Wireless Internet is available at airports, hotels, tourist information centers, public facilities, including subways and train stations, and even many restaurants and cafes. Visitors can access the Internet by logging in at hotspots through major carriers such as KT, SK, and LG or paying fees with a credit card. Prepaid SIM cards can be purchased at most convenience stores and be selected according to the length of stay. Those who need continued access to the Internet may rent a smartphone or portable router at Incheon International Airport or Gimpo International Airport to create a hotspot.
